










### ELEPHANTS

- 1. There are two elephant species
   the African and the Asian
  elephant.
- Female elephants have longer pregnancies than any other mammal 22 months.
- 3. Elephants touch trunks when greeting each other and never leave a herd member behind, even when in danger.
- Elephants spend up to 18 hours a day eating and produce up to 100 kg (220 lbs) of dung!
- 5. Elephants use sunscreen! After a water bath, they'll throw mud/ sand over themselves to protect their skin from the sun!

### MONKEYS

- Groups of monkeys are known as a 'troop', 'tribe' or 'mission'.
- There are over 260 different species of monkeys in the world.
- 3. Monkeys express affection, show their love, and make up with one another by grooming each other.
- 4. Monkeys have opposable thumbs, which enables them to use tools and play games.
- Monkeys are omnivores.
  Different monkey species eat
  a variety of foods, such as
  fruit, flowers, leaves, seeds,
  nuts, honey, eggs,
  insects and reptiles.

### GIRAFFES

- Baby giraffes are able to stand within half an hour of being born.
- Giraffes have very long tongues – they can be over 50cm in length!
- 3. Male giraffes can grow to up to 5.5 metres tall.
- Depending on where they live, giraffes have different markings. Some giraffes have square markings and some look like leaves.
- 5. They eat over 40kg of leaves and twigs every day that's the same as two big suitcases full.


An elephants trunk

# FACTS

### ZEBRAS

- Zebra stripes provide camouflage when they're in tall grasses. When they are in large groups together, the stripes also confuse predators.
- Each zebra's stripes are as unique as human fingerprints, no two are alike. A foal can recognise its mum from her stripes.
- Zebras can run faster than a lion! They can gallop at speeds of up to 65 kmph (40 mph).
- Every year, they migrate over 2,800 kilometres (1,800 miles) looking for grass to eat.
- Zebra foals are born with brown and white stripes.

## TOUCANS

- Toucans live in small flocks in the rainforest canopies of Central and South America.
- Though the beak is huge, it weighs very little. It's made from keratin – the same stuff as your hair and nails.
- 3. The toucan's beak has a knifelike edge for gripping food. It also has a bristly tongue for tasting.
- The toucan gets its name from the croaking sound it makes. People often think they're hearing frogs when toucans are 'talking'.
- 5. As part of their mating ritual, some toucans toss fruit to each other to catch in their beaks.

### LIONS

- As well as African lions, there are a small number of Asiatic lions living in India.
- African lions hunt at dawn and dusk. They prey on zebras, gnus and antelopes.
- 3. Lions are the only big cats to have tufty tails and manes.
- A lion's mane has a practical use

   it gives extra padding around
  the neck in fights
- 5. Lions are the only big cats to live in social groups together.





Lion and tiger bodies are so similar, when they're bald, only a expert can tell them apart!
